What student wrote:

"For example modern transportation systems could increase manufacturing competitiveness cheaply and quickly, moving raw materials to producers and manufactured goods to consumers, but poor energy can cause additional costs on firms such as lost production, or damaged equipment which would decrease productivity."

 Source was not referenced by student = plagiarism. Student puts his/her IB diploma at risk.

G11 May Exam 5 Tips...

- 1. Section A (Essay): Both microeconomic essays will come past IB papers. Complete questions (parts A and B) will be used exactly as they appeared in the IBO exam for that year. See full IBO exam questions in the 'IBQ Exam Papers' folder in the Subber shared folder
- 2. Section B (Data Response): Only sections 4.1 + 4.2 + 4.3 will be tested. Be sure that you are familiar with the diagrams used in development e.g. PPC and Poverty Cycle. Also, when answering your question in Section B be sure to quote or directly refer to the text you are using as evidence. Try and put in the paragraph number from where you took the information to support your answer.
- 3. Some microeconomic (Syllabus section 1) theory will be needed to answer the questions in section B. Specific reference to microeconomics will be made in some question parts i.e. Part A (define), parts B + C (draw / explain)
- 4. SL + HL will be given the same exam paper with the same instructions.
- 5. Time yourself carefully during the exam allowing 45 minutes to answer each question. At the start you will be given an additional 5 minutes reading time but you will not be allowed to write during this time. Use this time to select which question you will answer from each section: Section A and Section B.
