IB Economics: how are you assessed?

GRADING DETAILS

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IBO Economics and Business +Management courses: Mr. Buckley

PLEASE KEEP THIS IN YOUR Process Folio (PF) FOR REFERENCE: it has some useful reminders!

1) All work is graded by means of a points/marks system. See 3 below.

2) All PF work is weighted. A standard piece of assessed work will have a weighting of 1. The weighting figures are in a range from 1 - 5. Each grade 1 is worth 100 points, grade 2 is 200 points etc. Each assignment will therefore be worth between 100 and 500 points depending upon the grade number of the assignment.. Total points per semester are approximately 2000. You can calculate your grade as a percentage of the total number of points e.g. if you have been awarded a total of 1500 points your grade is 75%, a 6 grade. Please talk to me about grades allocated for work in the classroom (See 2 above).

4) GRADES WILL BE AWARDED AS FOLLOWS (Both IB 1-7 and % grades are normally given to students:

6) THE FOLLOWING ABBREVIATIONS ARE COMMONLY USED IN THE CORRECTION OF WRITTEN WORK.

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S = spelling	TR = table required

TS = written work too brief	E = excellent work

7) Written homework in pen only. No pencils please !! (in exams pencils may be used for diagrams).

8) Class examinations based on the same points system will be given occasionally. Adequate notice will be given. Please note that the process portfolio should be seen as an opportunity to improve your grade if your exams do not go as well as you expect. Invest some time here to build a good process portfolio. Please look at the rubric here to clearly understand expectations.

Non/W + W	4 PROCESS FOLIO COLLECTED AND ASSESSED. (40-60 %)
ORAL	5 PRESENTATIONS IN CLASS based on your research (G10 Business + Management only)
W	6 FINAL SEMESTER EXAM (50-60%) In I.B. exams it is 75-80%. <u>This may not apply to business and management.</u>
W	7 INTERNAL ASSESSMENT/COURSEWORK/this is a written analysis of a newspaper article

Note: The weighting of the semester exams can vary from year to year and it is dependent on the level of formative assessment preparation that was undertaken. In cases where students have less experience of an assessment component the weighting of the semester exam can be reduced and in this case have a 25 – 60% weighting range. The priority here is to make the testing appropriate in terms of sufficient practice needed for students to perform to a high standard. The testing is designed to allow students to show what they know in the subject and specifically it is not designed to find out what students do not know. Therefore students will whenever possible be given a choice in terms of answering questions in an exam setting. Sometimes you will be given the exam questions before the exam.

10) A range of different types of assessment are be used. However one priority is to prepare students for external public exams and the assessment will reflect this.

NOTE 1: The sources for assessment are outlined in item 9 above. A combination of these will be used to determine final results in the relevant course. These forms of assessment will make up the bulk of the assessment. In most of my courses these components are equal to 100% of your grade.

NOTE 2: A big emphasis is placed on the Process Portfolio. See the website (<http://www.yellowsubmariner.com>) for details. Notes on the Process Portfolio can be found in the Assessment tab under the *Process Folio and Grading* grading link. Process portfolio grade will help to determine your final grade and it can (should) help to increase your grade following written exams.

NOTE 3: A mixture of formative and summative assessment techniques will be used. The formative assessment should be understood as preparation for the summative assignments. Class tests are designed to prepare students for final summative assessment such as the IBO exam taken at the close of the Diploma programme.
